# 1 Opening of the General Assembly (GA)

## 1.1 Welcome

Mathias Bolt Lesniak, a member of the Board, welcomed the attendees at the General Assembly 2024. The event, online and in person at the Youth Hostel in Zürich, Switzerland, started at 13:00 h on 18 April 2024.

Fifty-eight members registered for the assembly upfront. Forty-one members attended the GA in person or online, with 41 valid votes.

Note: Not every eligible voter participated in every vote. Votes not cast are counted as abstentions.

## 1.2 Attending Board and BCC members

All members of the Board and BCC were present, either online or in person.

# 2 Election of the person in charge of counting the votes

The General Assembly elected Peter Kraume to be in charge of counting the votes.

Result: 36 accept, zero against, five abstain.

# 3 Acceptance of the GA Protocol 2023

Mathias Bolt Lesniak asked the attending members if they accepted the [GA 2023](#) protocol.

Result: 28 accept, zero against, 13 abstain.

# 4 Annual reports

## 4.1 Board

Olivier Dobberkau, President of the TYPO3 Association, provided an overview of the Board activities in 2023:

- The Board had 24 regular board meetings
- We focused on the overall strategy for the project, product, and association.
- Defined a functions model and redistributed responsibilities
- Finalized and Published the TYPO3 Association Strategy
- Collaboration between the TYPO3 Association Board and the Supervisory Board of TYPO3 GmbH

- The TYPO3 Association Board holds regular meetings to discuss the project's strategic direction and make important decisions about its operations.  
These meetings provide a forum for board members to collaborate and share ideas and to ensure that the interests of the TYPO3 community are represented in all decisions.

### **Work on the overall Strategy**

- The TYPO3 Association Board has been working closely with an organizational consultant to identify areas for action to ensure the continued success and growth of the TYPO3 project.
- This has included reviewing the project's organizational structure, processes, and governance and analyzing its strengths and weaknesses.
- Through this collaboration, the TYPO3 Association Board has identified key action points that will help to ensure the continued success and growth of the TYPO3 project.
- We will inform the members of the following steps and how to be part of the work.

### **Redefining the mission, vision, and purpose**

- As part of our efforts to improve the overall strategy of the TYPO3 project, the TYPO3 Association Board has redefined the project's mission, vision, and purpose.
- This has involved a thorough review of the project's values and principles and a renewed focus on the needs and interests of the TYPO3 community.

- This collaboration is essential for the continued success of the TYPO3 project, as it enables a strong partnership between its commercial and community-driven aspects.

#### **4.1.1 Trademarks**

Report by Ric van Westhreenen – presented by Olivier Dobberkau

In 2023, the protection of the brand was intensified. The following actions were taken to achieve the goal:

- Process optimization
  - We automated the check to see if a domain is in use. We only do manual and visual

- checks when it is.
- We check for duplicates because it happens that domains are brought to our attention multiple times.
- Take down websites and domains
- Managed existing trademark registration
- Opposition against trademark registrations
- Advised and coached usage of our trademark

Other channels watched besides the domain registry:

- Twitter/X
- ChatGPT
- LinkedIn
- Ads (Google Ads, Facebook Ads)
- Websites and logos

Results:

- We monitor 456 domains, of which 158 domains are active
- Of those 158 domains, we classified them as follows
  - 30 for sale
  - 10 not reachable
  - 56 are some sort of server messages that are under development, etc.
  - 6 are spam/sex/gamble site
  - 6 are community efforts, meaning they support some kind of community-driven development/initiative
  - 12 redirect to TYPO3.org
  - 38 are under investigation or pre-legal action

## 4.2 Annual report by the Business Control Committee (BCC)

Report by Ingo Schmitt, Chairman of the BCC

The BCC has reviewed the bookkeeping of the TYPO3 Association from 2023 on an accounting basis. This was based on accounting balance sheets for each account and full access to the digital archive of all invoices. The cashier's assistant clarified ambiguous bookings and namings. The communication with the TYPO3 Board is on a stable and good workflow.

The final bookkeeping is in good order. The TYPO3 Association has solved all problems found during the reviews.

Overall, in 2023, the spending has aligned with the granted budgets.

The BCC has reviewed the final report for the bookkeeping for 2022 for TYPO3 GmbH. The final report is in order. Part of sales have been reclassified to comply with tax regulations. This resulted in a technical loss for 2022, but it will show up as earnings in the future. The BCC supports this change.

We have reviewed the budgets and reports in the reimbursement tool. One side note: Since the core development was funded by TYPO3 GmbH, the amount of work in reviewing the bookings was significantly reduced because this was the account with the most bookings.

Again, in 2023, not all budgets were used according to the granted budgets. In comparison to previous years, the overall amount of unused team budget funds has decreased. Nevertheless, we ask all budget owners to give active information to the BCC if they are expecting that not all granted money can be used during 2024. Then, parts of the budget can be reallocated to different projects or the following year.

At the GA, Oliver Perle was elected as the 4th BCC member. We are happy with the fresh contribution and insights.

The board and the BCC worked on the concept of community ideas during 2023. Rather than allocating a budget for a whole year, funding has been changed to a quarterly basis. The first round of community ideas was started in Q3 of 2023, so the first projects could be granted beginning in January 2024.

The budget process for 2024 started in 2023. All teams were granted the budget in time for an early planning process.

### **4.3 Report by the TYPO3 GmbH**

Report by Daniel Fau, CEO of TYPO3 GmbH

Over the past year, TYPO3 GmbH has undergone significant changes to optimize its structure and ensure its future growth. One of the key updates has been the addition of a new tax accountant, reflecting a commitment to robust financial oversight and compliance. Notably, the company implemented accruals for the first time, calculating a technical loss for the year 2022. However, these changes were strategically designed to enhance future cash flow planning, setting the stage for a more sustainable financial model.

Looking at 2023, the projected revenue is approximately EUR 3.4 million before factoring in accruals. The company has already demonstrated its ability to operate with a profit. With a team of 19 employees, TYPO3 GmbH is focused on maintaining sustainable staffing levels to support development and operational functions. This is complemented by an increased emphasis on actively managing the TYPO3 ecosystem, ensuring alignment with industry needs, and fostering collaboration.

Another critical initiative has been establishing and expanding a value chain that now includes 42 committed partners. This network strengthens the company's market presence and enhances its ability to deliver value to stakeholders. Together, these efforts reflect TYPO3 GmbH's dedication to building a resilient and forward-thinking organization.

## 4.4 GDPR Report

Report by Karen Falkenberg – presented by Olivier Dobberkau

### Background

Since implementing the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) in 2018 and adopting the new Data Processing Agreement (DPA) as of 01.09, the TYPO3 Association has taken significant steps to ensure compliance with data protection laws.

### Responsible Parties:

### Key Statistics

#### 1. Membership and User Data:

- 1,020 members registered with the TYPO3 Association as of **08.02.2024**.
- 18,954 registered users on **my.typo3.org** as of **10.04.2024**.

#### 2. Data Subject Interactions:

- 10 inquiries were received from data subjects.
- 10 processes were initiated to handle requests from affected parties.

#### 3. Data Deletions:

- **139** self-initiated deletions by users.
- 2 cases requiring identity clarification, followed by timely deletion of subject data.

#### 4. Notifications to Supervisory Authority:

- **Zero** notifications were made to the supervisory authority, indicating no significant incidents or breaches requiring escalation.

#### 5. Training and Supervision:

- Conducted several data protection training sessions for teams.
- The supervisory authority initiated no inspections or control measures during this reporting period.

### Observations and Compliance Highlights

- The TYPO3 Association has maintained a proactive stance on GDPR compliance by addressing all data subject requests in a timely and systematic manner.



- The absence of incidents requiring notification to the supervisory authority demonstrates effective data protection practices and risk mitigation.
- Regular training sessions for internal teams underline the association's commitment to fostering awareness and adherence to GDPR principles.
- The organization has effectively managed identity verification and data deletion processes without external intervention.

## 5 Annual balance sheet and report by the cashier

Stefan Busemann, Treasurer of the TYPO3 Association, went through the annual report and balance sheet and explained the numbers. You can download the report from the GA 2024 page: <https://typo3.org/project/association/structure/general-assembly/2024/>

Main facts:

- Total assets on 2023-12-31 was 1.6 M EUR
- Total equity on 2024-12-31 was 1.3 M EUR
- Total revenue in 2023 was 646k
- Profit 2023 was 170k EUR
- BDO audited the accounting and closing of books

## 6 Disencumbering of members of the board, cashier, accountants, and commissions

- The board members were discharged with 30 yes votes, 10 abstains, and one against by the members.
- The members of the BCC were discharged with 37 yes votes, and four abstains by the members.
- The cashier was discharged with 38 yes votes and three abstains by the members.
- The accountant was discharged with 35 yes votes, and six abstains by the members.

## 7 Budget for the running year

The TYPO3 Association's budget is created yearly. During this process, the budget ideas are presented and discussed publicly. After this phase, the members of the TYPO3 Association are asked for their opinion in a poll.

The Budget 2024 covers 1.000.000,00 €

- 182.000 € are planned for administration and community teams
- 79.440 € are planned for infrastructure
- 86.000 € are planned for product development
- 299.640 will be invested in innovation, events, and education
- The TYPO3 company will fund the Core Development and Marketing with more than 500.000 €

102.970 € are still open for "budget ideas" from the community.

## 8 Determination of admission fees and annual dues for all types of members

- Membership Management was handed over to the TYPO3 GmbH
- The number of members continued to increase
  - End-of-year 2021: 887 members
  - End-of-year 2022: 953 members
  - End-of-year 2023: 1011 members
- With the introduction of new membership types, we expect a further increase in memberships.

No changes to admission fees and annual dues have been made. For 2025, a change is planned.

## 9 Elections

### 9.1 Board Election

The TYPO3 Association Board election, which took place between March 28 and April 10, 2023, has given the following results:

Hinzer, Boris	30.86% (175 Votes )

Those nominees are elected now until the GA 2026. All nominees have accepted their election.

The General Assembly approved the online voting with 39 yes votes, one abstain, and one against.

### 9.2 BCC Election

Two of the four positions in the BCC are elected alternating each year. The online voting took place between March 28 and April 10, 2023.

Weiland, Jochen	53.83% (225 Votes )

Those nominees are elected now until the GA 2026. All nominees have accepted their election.

The General Assembly approves online voting with 41 yes votes, one abstain, and zero votes against.

## 11 Program of activities

### Highlights:

- **Academic Committee**
  - The committee had regular meetings.
  - The focus was on organizing the University Days in Darmstadt. The event was successful, with more than 100 participants.
- **Community Expansion Committee:**
  - The reported activities include promotion, representation, and engagement with governments, international development organizations, and local technical communities.
  - The following events and activities have been made:
    - Participation at the Transform Africa Summit conference
    - Organizing a community event in Zimbabwe
    - Involvement in the e-Governance Conference 2023 in Tallinn, Estonia, and sponsoring the event
    - Participation at the CMS Africa Summit Nairobi and sponsoring the event
    - On-site engagement with the government of Papua New Guinea, including workshops and a public conference
    - On-site discussions with the governments, technical communities, and international development agencies in Uganda and Kenya
    - TYPO3 workshop for the government of Senegal in Dakar
  - Development of the expansion strategy and budget plan for 2024
  - Development of the strategy and action plan for the GovStack TYPO3 Somalia project
  - Development of the presentations and action plan for the government of Senegal

- **Core Team**
  - The main focus was the development of TYPO3 12 LTS - <https://typo3.org/article/typo3-v12-lts-here-to-save-the-day>.
  - **From January to March 2023, the Core mergers, along with dozens of contributors, worked towards adding the last final features for TYPO3 v12 LTS.**
    - More than 80 new features were added, along with two new sprint releases - TYPO3 v12.2
    - (February) and TYPO3 v12.3 (March) until the v12 LTS version.
    - One code sprint organized at F7 Hamburg in January 2023 brought contributors and mergers
    - together for one week - some met in person for the first time, and the week was very productive.
    - The location for the sprint in Hamburg allowed people in other areas (e.g., Kiel or Rostock) to join

- easily, which was good for opening sprints up for new contributors.
  - As for the budget, Q1 saw the budget be used for the code sprint reimbursements and various
  - costs related to the news announcement from Michael Schams and minor travel reimbursements.
- **From March - June 2023, the Core mergers worked towards a stable release for TYPO3 v12 LTS.**
  - We delivered a TYPO3 v12 LTS version on time, which is excellent and essential.
  - TYPO3 v12 shipped all the features we promised and much more - over 135 new features.
  - CPS IT organized a June sprint in Berlin to make the Introduction Package frontend-wise accessibility-ready (BITV review) using the Core budget.
  - We also kickstarted a new merger application round and found new people to join the Core
  - development team, which is excellent - especially in the Backend UX area, where I hope to get some more deliverables done with the UX team.
- In the second half of 2024, we've seen regular maintenance and bugfix releases for TYPO3 v12
  - LTS and TYPO3 v11 LTS mainly revolve around outstanding issues related to the CKEditor5 upgrade.
  - A security release for TYPO3 Core was published in November by the Security Team.
  - The Community Sprint in November in Düsseldorf saw massive work around further TYPO3 v13
  - work, mainly as preparations for the upcoming features in the next year.
  - One of the main features will be a new API to override settings (via a new Settings API), templates, and import records on a per-site basis.
  - As for the budget, Q4 saw the budget to be used for some sprint reimbursements and various
  - fixing essential bugs. In addition, 5000€ was sponsored for the Doctrine DBAL project for the Doctrine team to finalize Doctrine/DBAL version 4, which is expected to be released in Q1 of 2024.
- **Documentation Team**
  - During the first quarter of 2023, there have been some significant changes in the Documentation Team. Martin Bless, who has been an integral part of the team for many
  - years, has decided to step down as the Documentation Team leader. However, he will continue to be a valuable member and provide support to the team. We extend our heartfelt appreciation to Martin Bless for his immense contributions to the TYPO3 project, especially for his pivotal role in transitioning the documentation to reStructuredText and developing the documentation rendering chain based on Sphinx. Considering these changes, we are pleased to announce that Lina Wolf has taken on the new Documentation Team leader position. Lina has been actively involved in the team and has much experience. So, at the beginning of the year, we have Lina Wolf (leader), Martin Bless, Chris Müller, Tom Warwick, and David Bruchmann. See team pages

  - As always, lots of community members also contributed to the documentation.
  - As TYPO3 version 12 approaches its LTS release scheduled for April 2023, the team has diligently updated the documentation to reflect all changes and enhancements introduced in this version.
  - Development of the RST-parser: Ryan Weaver from the Symfony team and Lina Wolf,

leader of the documentation team, envisioned a collaborative effort to improve the doctrine/rst-parser package. This cooperation aimed to enhance documentation efficiency for both Symfony and TYPO3 developers. With shared challenges in managing changes across versions and documenting third-party packages, the teams sought to streamline their documentation processes through this partnership.

- T3DD Preparations and GitHub Activities: The team actively prepared for the TYPO3 Developer Days by marking issues, creating essential resources, and engaging in statistical analysis of contribution activities on GitHub.
- TYPO3 Social Instance and Extension Challenges: The team launched the TYPO3 Social Instance for registrations and addressed issues related to the Example Extension for Version 12, ensuring its optimal functionality.
- Documentation Enhancement and Maintenance: Ongoing efforts were directed towards refining documentation, such as the Recycler Manual Rework led by Sarah McCarthy. The team remained dedicated to addressing ChangeLog-To-Doc issues, fostering accurate and updated documentation.
- Challenges in Software Maintenance and Collaborations: Lina Wolf discussed the complexities associated with software maintenance, particularly concerning TYPO3 GmbH Server issues. Collaborative efforts were emphasized to address these challenges effectively.
- Milestones and Celebrations: Celebrating the inaugural release of phpDocumentor marked a significant achievement for the team, reinforcing their commitment to community resources and development.
- **Education Committee**
  - All exams are live in version 11LTS. All teams are now focused on bringing 12LTS to market.
  - Immediately after the release of TYPO3 12LTS, we met for an Education Committee Sprint in Düsseldorf to coordinate the next procedure and exchange measures and goals for the certification of the 12LTS release.
  - In a constructive sprint, we were able to set up the corresponding task forces well, onboard new members, and agree on the goal that all task forces deliver an MVP for the certifications for 12LTS in Q3.
  - The MVP is defined as:
    - The syllabus is ready and can be published.
    - All new skills are built into the corresponding SkillTree and logically linked.
    - All deprecated skills are configured dormant in the SkillTree
    - All existing questions are reviewed to see if they are still appropriately worded for 12LTS and either adjusted or removed.
  - The task force reports on progress. As things stand, work for the TCCC review is progressing well. In addition, efforts are being made to build up the skills tree, which has been missing up to now, to be consistent with the other certifications.
  - The TCCI and TCCD task forces report good progress.
  - Unfortunately, the TCCE task force is experiencing a delay due to a critical team member's situation. We are working on a solution in coordination with the team members.
- **UX Team**
  - The team had monthly meetings and worked permanently on improving the User Interface of TYPO3.
- **Best Practices Team**
  - Becoming a Team and Applying for Budget: The evolution of becoming a team had many steps and topics. We needed to read all the rules, create a document explaining our

team idea, create our team page, and have a call with the Data Privacy officer. We also needed to sign documents for our budget and data privacy.

- **Joining Forces:** We join forces with other projects regarding best practices. A likely candidate was the `demo.typo3.org` project, but that team finished their mission by providing a demo instance. The `typo3.org` team now maintains the project. We have had meetings with that team and will work together to present the `demo.typo3.org` site as a best practice example for TYPO3 projects. That way, interested community members have a best practices example extension and a best practices example project at hand. We also moved our bi-weekly meeting date to make it easier for other teams to attend. This should improve cross-team communication.  
The `typo3.org` team and our team are looking for people willing to help out. Both teams lack enough people to work on all the topics and drive things forward. Get in touch if you want to be involved.
- **TYPO3 v12 Compatibility:** The existing extension and the project are compatible with the latest TYPO3 v12 LTS. Thanks to all the people involved.
- **Add Features To The Extension:** The extension received several new features. Some were used for training on extension development, and others were requested from the TYPO3 Documentation team in our ongoing effort to provide tested and maintained code examples for official documentation. A short list of those features:  
Ability to hide teas based on `fe_groups`  
Added CRUD functionality  
Make the records localizable.
- **Auto Update Dependencies:** EXT:tea has a workflow to auto update dependencies. This is achieved via GitHub Actions, auto approval of pull requests, and Dependabot. This removes the need to manually keep dependencies up to date and review PRs created by Dependabot. Interested developers can have a look at the corresponding PR 818.

- **Motivation Research Team**

- The Motivation Research Team has had a very active year 2023. The team has grown by three new members, presented at several events, conducted a community motivation survey, connected with the EMPAMOS research project, and developed the first tools to increase team motivation.
- The TYPO3 Motivation Research Team was founded in late 2021 and has seen a very active 2023 in its work. By presenting the team at several bar camps and conferences, the team grew by three new members (which was very motivating!).
- **Motivation Through Game Mechanics:** While studying motivation psychology and gamification research, the team heard of the EMPAMOS research project at the Technische Hochschule Nürnberg. The project analyzes games for motivational elements that can systematically be applied in non-game contexts to increase motivation. For the motivation research team, after studying gamification and self-determination theory, the EMPAMOS method was the logical next step. It allowed the team to build motivation tools that were very structured and productive.
- **Learning and Levelling-Up:** To improve the team's skills with this method, three team members attended the first EMPAMOS workshop to learn the basics of the approach. Two team members also attended the EMPAMOS barcamp to present the team and learn about the latest research.  
The team also conducted a community survey on what motivates and demotivates the community members.  
After evaluating the results from the survey, the team has identified the first three areas

to focus on:

Appreciation; getting positive/constructive feedback; quick results & successes

Ability to resolve conflicts or address problems

Learning and growing; solving problems; trying new things; curiosity

- Testing Motivation Tools Across TYPO3 Teams: Using the EMPAMOS method, the team has now built sets of tools to increase motivation in three specific contexts:
  - Address and resolve conflicts in teams.
  - Help open-source projects get more code reviews, making the review queue less intimidating.
  - Facilitate learning and personal growth in projects to avoid stagnation and boredom.
- At this point, the Motivation Research Team is beta-testing these tools in collaboration with the TYPO3 community teams and will publish them to be publicly available soon.
- **Ombudsperson Group:** No activities have been reported
- **Localization Team**
  - TYPO3camp RheinRuhr
    - Peter Kraume represented the Localization Team at the TYPO3camp RheinRuhr (3.-5.11.2023). There was a session where all TYPO3 community teams and committees were presented. Besides the Localization Team, the Documentation Team, the Best
    - For 2024, we plan to have our team at as many camps as possible.
  - TYPO3 Community Sprint Autumn
    - Abdulhamid Kwieder and Peter Kraume attended the TYPO3 Community Sprint Autumn for three days at the TYPO3 GmbH office. They were very productive and worked on several todos.
    - Improved documentation for contributors and extension authors
    - Updated Crowdin Description: The description now gives more information about TYPO3, how to start translating, and where to get support.
    - News about Pootle shutdown: The article has been written and published on 3.12.2023
    - Many duplicate labels in Crowdin: We have been talking with TYPO3 core members about ideas for reducing the number of duplicate labels used in almost every system extension. Some tasks need to be done in the TYPO3 core, e.g., removing the "magic" way labels for backend modules are automatically fetched from xliff files. Once this is done, we can start moving labels around.
    - Tutorial videos: Together with Tom Warwick from TYPO3 GmbH, we have been working on the storyboard for two tutorial videos: one for volunteers who want to translate the core and extensions into their language and one for extension developers who want to support translations with Crowdin. Tom Warwick is currently working on the first shots. The videos are planned to be released in Q1 2024.
    - Updated the team website on typo3.org
    - Brainstorming about marketing to get more people to contribute to translations. We recorded a short video to attract new translators. The next step is to add a new section on translation to the Contribution section of the official documentation. The video will be released as soon as the new section is ready.
  - Other Activities: Abdulhamid Kwieder became co-leader of the team. He also received the "Personality of the Year" award at T3CON23 for his work on translating TYPO3 into Arabic. The Spanish translation of TYPO3 also took a big step forward in November, mainly due to the efforts of Andrea Cay. We had three team meetings in Q3 and Q4.
- **Marketing Team**

- The Marketing Team is currently the biggest and youngest it's ever been, with more than 14 regular contributors and four regular new team members within the last year. With this strong contributor base, we tackled more prominent topics with better results than ever. We didn't experience significant setbacks and are happy to report ongoing improvements.
- **TYPO3 Conference 2023**
  - Successful re-introduction after a four-year break
  - For the first time, we placed big advertisements in Handelsblatt and t3n, reaching more than 300.000 people combined
  - Successful TYPO3 Awards, reaching lots of people outside of the ecosystem
  - Recap posts are still ongoing and generate a substantial amount of traffic
- **Sales Enablement Survey**
  - Surveyed to reach out to agencies concerning the pros and cons of TYPO3 in the sales context
  - helpful insights as a basis for our ongoing marketing and communication efforts
- **Security Team**
  - Security Incident Handling:  
The TYPO3 Security Team – as the Product Security Incident Response Team (PSIRT), has coordinated reported vulnerabilities with corresponding maintainers and reporters/researchers. In the reporting period, one vulnerability in TYPO3 CMS was addressed (with three additional fixes in preparation), and six vulnerabilities in extensions were addressed.
  - Bug Bounty Program: Three rewards were granted during the reporting period. The “bug bounty program” and the “prize pot” at huntr.dev1 should be advertised more frequently to increase the number of high-quality reports.
  - TYPO3 CMS: TYPO3 v12 LTS was enhanced by several security features, including configurable password policies, anti-CSRF-login handling, and the Content-Security-Policy (CSP) configuration and handling framework2
  - Besides that, several changes to enhance the security of the upcoming TYPO3 v13 have been prepared. Most of those changes are considered breaking changes and will not be backported to existing TYPO3 versions.
- **Server Team**
  - The Team maintained the infrastructure of the TYPO3 project (f.e. typo3.org Server, Gitlab, Discourse, ...)

  - They participated at the July community sprint with two members and at the November community sprint with three members
- **typo3.org Team**
  - We held two Remote Days on the 15th and 25th of each month. During these sessions, we met on the official TYPO3 Discord server and worked from 8 pm to mostly midnight. Everybody was welcome to contribute.
  - Work done in 2023:
    - Fixed the REST API on extensions.typo3.org
    - Preparations for the v12 upgrade
    - Maintenance for typo3.org, voting.typo3.org, get.typo3.org and extensions.typo3.org


## 16 Goodbye
